## Steeple Chase raises \$71,000

WINDHAM — The 19th Annual Steeple Chase Bike Tour fundraiser held Aug. 21 raised more than \$71,000 and had 401 riders.

The Steeple Chase is sponsored by the Windham Area Interfaith Ministry and Perception Programs.

This is the fifth year that the Steeple Chase offered a corporation/cycling club/church challenge with the top three fundraisers winning a trophy.

The first-place trophy was won by Colchester Dental Group, which raised \$5,323 (trophy accepted

by owner Dr. Mike Babinski).

Second place went to Thread City Cyclists, which raised \$5,133 (trophy accepted by the President of TCC Eric Grove).
